Martin Smith's book, *A Season for the Spirit: Readings for the Days of Lent* is a spiritual classic, a rich, insightful and useful book. Here is some of what the Norwich Bookstore blurb says about it: "Originally commissioned by the Archbishop of Canterbury in 1991, *A Season for the Spirit* provides forty daily meditations for Lent, leading us on a journey of discovery in which we find that Christ, through the Spirit, embraces every aspect of our humanity. Each meditation concludes with a prayer and passage of scripture or quotation for further reflection and study." Pastor Tom Kinder says, "I have never found a better companion to take on the Lenten journey. I have read *A Season for the Spirit* year after year and always gained from its wisdom."
