

Mission Committee Update: Helping Children with a Parent in Prison, Victims of Domestic and Sexual Violence, New Refugee Arrivals in VT and Displaced People and Refugees Around the Globe This month, on behalf of our church, the Mission Committee has proudly supported the following four big-hearted, hard-working organizations:

- **1. Camp Agape Vermont** which provides a week of free overnight summer church camp for Vermont children with a parent in prison. (This is a collaboration between the United Methodist, the UCC and the Episcopal churches of Vermont.)
- **2. Safeline** which is located in Chelsea, VT and works "to end physical, emotional and sexual violence against women and children."
- **3. U.S. Committee for Refugees and Immigrants** (VT Field Office in Colchester, VT) which helps "hundreds of new refugee arrivals secure safe housing, enroll in school, get jobs, improve language skills and begin to thrive in communities across Vermont."
- **4. International Rescue Committee** which helps support "displaced people and refugees worldwide," providing "health care, education, safe spaces, emergency aid and more."
