The people came to Moses and said, "We have sinned by speaking against God and against you; pray to God to take away the serpents from us." *Numbers 21:4-7a*

Assurance of Pardon and Grace reflecting on this passage: So Moses prayed for the people. And God said to Moses, "Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole; and everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live."
